Peter Horwood, Director Furniture Department: *"The sale demonstrated yet again that there remains a strong demand for rare and high quality English furniture, clocks and works of art. There was fierce competition from both private and trade buyers for many lots, particularly those with noble provenance and for items that are fresh to the market. The top lots in the sale were all consigned from private collections, led by lot 150, a superb pair of over-scale neoclassical mirrors of circa 1795, which realised £122,500. Their companion 'Palladian' marble-topped side tables, lot 151, sold for £110,500; the latter were formerly in the collection of Mary, Duchess of Roxburghe at Carlton House Terrace. An extremely rare and beautiful scagliola mirror, circa 1675, lot 90, sold for £68,500, more than doubling the pre-sale estimate, while a collection of Regency furniture supplied to the Duke of Leeds for Hornby Castle, Yorkshire, and descended in the family, far exceeded pre-sale expectations. We look forward to our next sales, Un Moment de Perfection, on 3 December, and The Collection of Dr. Peter D. Sommer, on 4 December 2014."*
