The sale witnessed particularly competitive bidding for the works from the sale's private collections, highlighted by Property from the Estate of Eric Martin Wunsch, which realized \$2.2 million, including the sale's top lot, a *Chippendale Carved Mahogany Scallop-Top Tea Table* which realized \$908,000. Favorites from the Collection of Kristina Barbara Johnson, also performed well, totaling \$855,375. Chippendale furniture fetched strong prices throughout the sale, comprising seven of the top ten lots. We look forward to the conclusion of Americana Week on January 27, with the sale of Chinese Export Art."
